RAHAB Ministries strives to share the hope of Jesus Christ with broken and undervalued women and children, including survivors of human trafficking.

What You Will Do/Need (Volunteer Summary)

Hope Recovery Volunteers serve during Hope Recovery Bible Study to help provide an inviting atmosphere for the women we serve as well as provide one-on-one connection with women during Hope Recovery. Hope Recovery consists of a shared, casual meal, worship, Bible Study, and a time for personal connection. A Hope Recovery Volunteer may perform all of the varying tasks during programming: help set up for the day, prepare food, engage in Bible Study with the women, lead small prayer groups during Bible Study at the teacher's request, connect with women individually, pray with women individually, help tear down and clean up from the day, and transport women in volunteer's personal vehicle if comfortable doing so (all transport is under the discretion of the staff on-site).

Open Hours consist of times when the Drop-In is open for the women we serve, but there is no scheduled or structured programming.

GOAL- *The goal is to build a transformational relationship with the women we serve, where the volunteer embodies the love of Christ and exemplifies how God desires His children to be loved and treated. To serve the without personal expectation or agenda; Simply serve as Jesus served; humbly and selflessly.*

Responsibilities (Essential Duties and Responsibilities)

- Arrive on time for prayer, help set up for programming (light cooking responsibilities, cleaning and organization, making coffee, setting out refreshments)
- Welcome women as they arrive, be present for conversation and fellowship
- Participate in bible study, modeling engagement with programming
- Help prepare the meal for the day
- Help lead the devotion time
- Foster conversation with women at the house
- Help with clean-up of Drop-In Center after programming
- Model healthy boundaries and relationships

Coordination:

- Communicate Volunteer Coordinator for schedule, to gain support, advice, or direction in regard to serving



- Complete Volunteer Time Sheets
- Attending Volunteer meetings done by RAHAB staff

Minimum Qualifications (Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities Required)

- Mature relationship with Christ
- Humble heart, team player with strong integrity
- Non-judgmental – Someone who accepts people as they are and is patient with their journey
- Someone who is consistent, honest and committed
- Adaptable to change that come with the nature of the role
- Trauma informed and the ability to perform trauma informed care
- General knowledge of human trafficking field and effects of sexual exploitation
- Strong communication skills, both written and verbal
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Must submit and pass a Federal Background check and BCI Check
- Must complete all training and paperwork as outlined by RAHAB

What Will Make You Special (Preferred Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities)

- Trauma informed
- Previous experience and knowledge in human trafficking field

Open hours vary (during time Drop-In is open)

Canton- Hope Recovery: Friday 1:00pm -5:00pm

Open hours vary (during the time when Drop-In is open)

Travel

Local travel within the Northeastern Ohio area using personal vehicle or RAHAB vehicle (if approved by RAHAB) to transport women within a small radius of the Drop-In.
