What you will Do/Need (Job Summary)

The Outreach Coordinator leads teams of volunteers who walk the streets, go into strip clubs, and correctional facilities to share the love and hope of Jesus Christ. The Outreach Coordinator will also maintain regular contact with drop-in staff in relevant counties to facilitate a connection between outreach and drop-in services.

Responsibilities (Essential Duties and Responsibilities)

Volunteer Management:

- Participate in all outreach efforts in current and future targeted venues (street, strip clubs, jails etc.) to provide ongoing support to volunteer teams
- Provide leadership and guidance to Akron/Cleveland team leaders to equip them to lead volunteer teams
- Assist in providing specialized training as new volunteers are onboarded
- Uphold RAHAB programming policies and procedures and provide consistent guidance for volunteer teams to do the same
- Regularly promote self-care practices and organize 2 annual self-care activities for volunteers
- Interview volunteers that have completed Essentials Training and who are interested in participating in outreach on behalf of RAHAB
- Provide administrative support by keeping detailed records in SharePoint
- Manage and submit volunteer time sheets/hours in CRM database
- Assist with volunteer appreciation efforts including an annual event

Collaboration:

- Collaborate with other area outreach and drop-in coordinators to increase communication between outreach and drop-in and strengthen RAHAB's continuum of care
- Nurture community and church relationships, specifically in Summit and Cuyahoga counties
- Attend bi-monthly RAHAB staff meetings
- Attend regular individual and team meetings
- Attend quarterly volunteer management meetings
- Participate in public speaking opportunities on behalf of RAHAB
- Communicate with appropriate staff when in-kind donations are needed to support outreach efforts
